To develop your skills

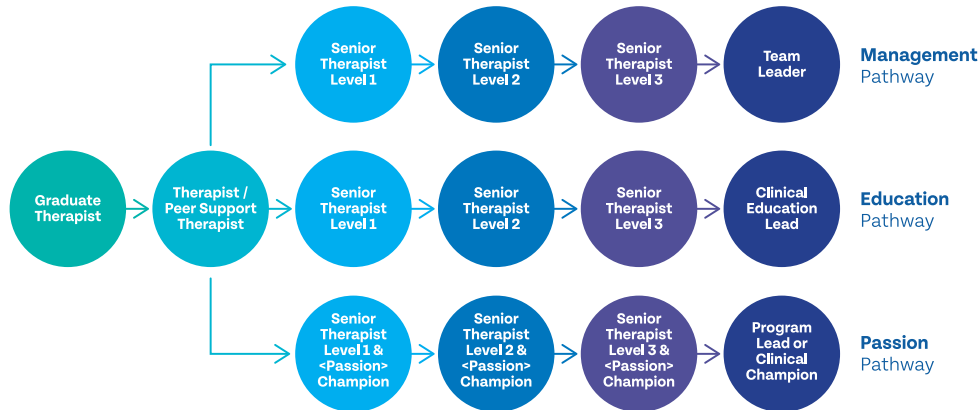
Each discipline has an Early Career Program to help you upskill in common neurological assessment and treatment techniques.

To help you feel supported

In your first three months, you will receive supervision from a senior therapist every week. The support will slowly decrease as you become more confident until the seven-month mark, when supervision settles to once every four weeks.

Our supervisors are senior therapists and have completed clinical supervision training. They are passionate and experienced therapists who love to share their knowledge with our newest team members.

We understand there is a lot to learn in the first six to twelve months. To allow time for you to build your confidence and skills as a NeuroRehab therapist, your KPI targets will slowly increase each month during this induction period.
