Allied Health Assistant Program



An Allied Health Assistant (AHA) is a member of your rehabilitation team. They work under the direct supervision of NeuroRehab Allied Health Network's Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Exercise Physiologists, Speech Pathologists and Music Therapists to complete therapy programs with you.

Allied Health Assistants can offer great value in supporting your therapy and rehabilitation goals. They can offer more regular therapy sessions for tasks which involve frequent repetition, exercise, communication or activities of daily life such as cooking.



How it works

1	ල	Your treating therapist will make a referral for your AHA program.
2	S	Our Customer Engagement Team will help source funding from Support Coordinators or Case Managers and allocate you an AHA. Then a Service Agreement* will be drawn up. *The Service Agreement details our Cancellation Policy including full fee for late cancellations including travel.
3		A training schedule will be organised with the therapist, AHA and yourself. The number of training sessions depend on when you are all comfortable and confident with the program.
4	Ċ	Your AHA will keep a record of each session. Programs are reviewed at least once every 4 months by the treating therapist to ensure your safety, and to make any relevant changes to the program if it has become too easy or hard. Reviews can be more frequent if there is a change in your functioning.
